Waddington and West Bradford School is committed to safeguarding and promoting the welfare of children. Staff, governors and volunteers require an enhanced DBS disclosure and regular safeguarding training.



SAFEGUARDING AIMS

- Establish and maintain an ethos where children feel secure and are encouraged to talk, and are listened to. That they have opportunities to talk and their wishes and feeling are sort, listened to and taken into account.
- Ensure that children know that there are adults in the school who they can approach if they are worried or are in difficulty.
- Include in the curriculum activities and opportunities for PSHE which equip children with the skills they need to stay safe and / or communicate their fears or concerns about abuse.
- Include in the curriculum material which will help children develop realistic attitudes to the responsibilities of adult life, particularly with regard to childcare and parenting skills. To enable them to develop to their full potential and enter adulthood successfully.
- Ensure that every effort will be made to establish effective working relationships with parents and colleagues from other agencies.

Our school is part of Operation Encompass, a safeguarding initiative that supports children who may have been affected by domestic abuse.

Operation Encompass works by ensuring that, when the police attend a domestic abuse incident where a child is present or lives in the household, the school is informed before the start of the next school day. This information is shared confidentially with the school's Designated Safeguarding Lead.

The purpose of this is to make sure that school staff are aware and can provide appropriate care and support for the child during the school day. This might include offering a listening ear, extra reassurance, or additional support as needed. The information is handled sensitively and only shared with staff who need to know.

Operation Encompass helps schools work closely with other agencies to ensure children feel safe, supported and ready to learn.
