The team work, collaboration, discussion and general fun was absolutely brilliant!

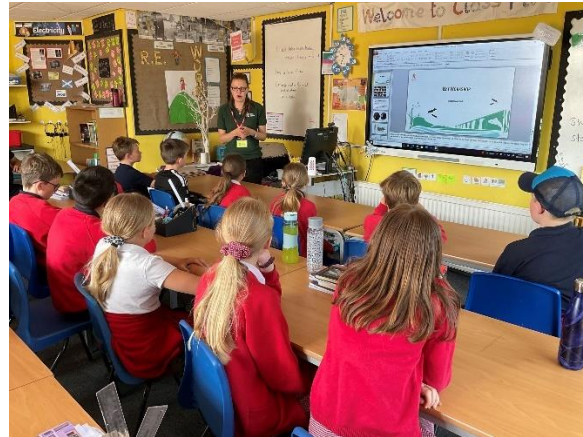
