English Overview

Harry the Happy Mouse-

At the beginning of this term we will be reading and enjoying poems. We will be reading and sharing popular poems and joining in with the reciting of them, to learn them and recognise the patterns. Finally, we will be learning by heart a poem, performing this and illustrating our own poems.

Later in the term we will be developing an information text and publishing this as a poster. We will be asking questions about different animals, then finding out the answers to be able to write these interesting animal facts in sentences. Finally, we will look at how we can arrange the information to create a poster.



Maths Overview

We will be teaching the children how to use mathematical equipment to help them to learn and consolidate their understanding of number.

Throughout Year 1 we will be consistently learning **Ordinal Numbers 1st -31st, days of the week and months of the year.**

Number and Place Value - Counting and representing 0 to 50, reading and writing numbers up to 20, Recognise 10s

Length and Mass/Weight- Compare length and height and light and heavy.

Addition and Subtraction - Number bonds to 10, part, part, whole language, add 10 and a single digit, subtract 10 and a single digit and solve one step problems.

2D and 3D Shape - Name circles, triangles, square rectangles, oblong rectangles, spheres, pyramids, cubes and cuboids and recognise them in different orientations.

SCIENCE

This term we will be looking at different animals and grouping them according to their features.

GEOGRAPHY

Throughout Year 1 we will keep an observational log at the beginning and end of each term. To note **the changes of the seasons**

This term we will be looking at hot and cold places across the world and how these are different to the UK and using maps and globes to locate countries.

ART

We will be drawing in pastel, looking at shades and tones. Our observational drawing, will then be developed into 3D animals using clay.

MUSIC

Hey you! Is our topic, we will listen to music, clap and repeat patterns and give our opinions of different pieces of music.

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

Harvest - Why do we celebrate harvest and how can we help those who do not have a good harvest.

PHYSICAL EDUCATION

Fundamental skill will be a focus and the children will continue to develop these throughout Year 1.

The children will be learning and perfecting their underarm throwing.
