This week has been jam packed with lots good work going on in all areas.

English- This week, we have been introduced to a couple of new characters in our class story and dived a little deeper into their charcater profile. The children have created some fantastic character descriptions and added to the thoughts and feelings of Daniel (our main charcater) as he goes through the story.

Maths- We have continued with fractions this week and linked into percentages as well. The children are becoming more confident with adding and subtracting fractions, making sure they find the common denominators. We worked on finding fractions of amounts by dividing the whole number by the denominator then multiplying by the numerator. We had fun creating a chant with actions to help try and remember this. On Thursday the children entered 'The Nowhere Maths Emporium' and applied their work on percentages by working out the cost of items around the room that were part of 'The Red Thursday' sale! Science- This week the children looked at light reflection and had a practical session looking at how the light reflects on different lines.

Reading books- Please encourage your child to read as much as possible and note in their journal. There has been a general increase across the class with the amount of reading being done. Well done to all those who have either maintained their amount of reading or made more effort and increased!
